

# Prep Marks Fall In Sacto Meet

SACRAMENTO (AP) — Three national prep records fell last night as many of the nation's top high school track and field stars turned in sensational performances in the Golden West Invitational meet.

Strongboy Karl Saib of Crosett, Ark., set a mark of 69-6

in the shot put, bettering the 69-3 of Olympic gold medal winner Dallas Long of Phoenix, Ariz. in 1958.

Joe Kurstock of Mt. Vernon, N.Y. sped to a 37.3 clocking in the 330-yard intermediate hurdles, shattering the former record of 37.8 set this year by Jack Faubion of McKinney, Tex., and Rocky Woods of San Angelo, Tex. Faubion finished third in 38.3.

Bill Tipton of Pontiac, Mich., ran 18.3 in the 180 low hurdles around a curve, eclipsing the 18.6 run by Wayne Collett of Gardena, Calif., this year. Collett was second last night in 18.6.

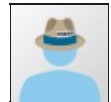
