

Tipton Leads State Victory

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) — Alabama star Richard Flowers hurdler Bill Tipton scored a double victory by setting one meet record and tying another Saturday in leading Michigan to the team title in the U.S. Jaycee Track and Field Championships here.

The two-day meet, which attracted some 400 young athletes from 39 states, produced eight records in 13 events, six of the new marks coming in the finals. Tipton, an 18-year-old speedster from Pontiac, Mich., whipped off an :18.4 time in the 18-yard low hurdles for a 10-ard victory, topping former

ve a smile to Coach Bump Elliott's face. "We wanted to see how the squad could hit and I was pleased with the result. While we lack experience at some spots, we made up for it in enthusiasm," he said.

Elliott had planned to emphasize the running game, but the first touchdown came on a 35-yard pass from Dennis Brown to Bill Harris.

Featured in the workout was some hard running by Warren Sipp and Ron Johnson.

Defensive back George Hoye of Flint, scored on an 85-yard punt return as Elliott tested the new punt rule. Hoye was sprung by a block by Cecil Prystyor.

MICHIGAN'S STADIUM is 40 years old this fall. Completed in 1927, it cost approximately one million dollars.

Alabama star Richard Flowers scored a 1965 record by two-tenths of a second.

Tipton also won in the 120-yard high hurdles with a :13.4 Phil clocking, tying the meet standard he set in the preliminaries Friday.

Another MKICHIGAN FLASH, Herb Washington of Flint, scored an upset win in the 100-yard dash with a time of 9.4 seconds. This was below the meet record but was not allowed because of anai ding 10 miles per hour wind.

The 11-man Michigan team scored 33½ points to out distance defending champion California which had 23 points.

Texas was third with 20 followed by Pennsylvania with 18 and Iowa 17. Jerry Richie of Pittsburgh came from fifth place late in the mile run to win in a record 4:10.8. The top six finishers bettered the old mark of 4:14.8 set by Robert Gordon of Wisconsin in 1965.

Elliott Garrett of Washington shattered the long jump standard with a leap of 24.7. The old mark was 24.2½ by Larry Franklin of Wisconsin in 1965.

A big Texan, Kelsin Korver of Irving, hurled the discus 176-11½ to smash the meet record of 174-0 set last year by Mike Gilmore of Oregon.

A Monroe, Wis., teen-ager, Mark Winzenreid, led most of the way in the 880-yard run for a new mark of 1:50.9. The former mark, 1:53.2, was set by John Lilly of California last year.

Casey Carrigan of Orting, Wash., smashed the pole vault record by equaling his career best of 15.4. He erased the 1965 mark by Texan Dickie Phillips.

Two meet records were broken in the preliminaries Friday —Tipton's :13.4 in the 120 high hurdles and the 68-1¼ shot put mark by Karl Salb, Ark., muscle man
