

Washington Aids Michigan's Win In Jaycee Track

DES MOINES, Iowa — Bill Tipton, Pontiac Central high hurdler, and Flint Central's speedy Herb Washington led Michigan to first place in the U.S. Jaycee Junior Track and Field championships Saturday.

Michigan totaled 35 points. California was second with 23 and Texas third with 20.

Tipton won both hurdles events, equaling his meet record of 13.4 in the highs that he set in the qualifying. He set another mark in the lows with an 18.4 clocking, and won the Outstanding Sportsmanship Award.

Washington, state Class A 100-yard dash champion this year, won his specialty with a wind-aided time of 9.4 seconds. There was a 10.7 miles per hour breeze when Washington competed.

Flint Northern's William Wallace was the next best Michigan finisher with a second place in the 220 dash. Wallace was timed in 21.8, compared to a 21.3 by Dan Moore of California.

Other Michigan finishers were: John Mock, Mount Clemens, fourth in 880, 1:53.5; Reggie Bradford, Detroit, fifth in 440, 49.2; Rod Mack, Detroit, tie for fifth in triple jump, 47-2 $\frac{3}{4}$.
