

**Patrick
Has 2:08.8
In 1000 Run**

Cleveland (AP) — Dave Patrick of Villanova won the 1,000-yard run in 2:08.8 Friday night at the 20th Knight of Columbus Track Meet, the fastest time ever on a 330-ft track.

Patrick, world's indoor record holder in the half mile at 1 minute 43.8 seconds had a 10-yard lead on Harrell Mitchell of the U.S. Army at the gun lap and won pulling away, breaking the meet record of 2:08.5.

Martin McCrady, world's indoor record holder in the 800, posted his 19th straight victory with a 1:19 effort to set a meet record.

Sam Bair of Kent State, silver medal winner last summer at the Pan-American Games in Winnipeg, won the 500 in 4:09.3, taking the lead on the last 10 yards (1:40) as Jerry Richey of Pittsburgh, who trailed 10 yards back at 4:07.

Over Ekko of Russia, the Soviet Union's 1,500-meter relay team finished in 6:09.5. Richey took the lead with a four laps to go, but Ekko stayed right on his heels and won easily after pulling ahead.

McCrady nipped Villanova's Larry James. His indoor mark is 1:10.

McCrady, running for the Santa Clara, Calif., Yasa Village, moved up from third to second place on the last lap and whisked by James in the last two steps.

Tatyana Tainshova of Russia, a hurdler and long jumper, won the women's 50-yard dash, topping Canada's Stephanie Hinton.

Mrs. Tainshova, one of six members of the Soviet Union's track and field team in the meet, hit the tape in 6.6.

Herb Washington, a 16-year-old senior at Fair, Mich., High School, took the men's 50-yard dash in 5.5.

Another world record holder, Madeline Manning of Tennessee State, led all the way in the women's 80 and won in 2:17.5, a half second in front of Nancy Slater of the Canton, Ohio, track club.

Villanova's Ery Hall was the 50-yard high hurdles in 6.4.

In two relay events, Sports International Track Club of Washington, won the women's 800-yard relay in 4:43.9 and the U.S. Air Force Academy won the University Distance Medley in 9:53.2.
