Mays breaks Canadian record

HAMILTON, Ont. (CP)—It's obvious that Charlie Mays picked the right man to help him train for the 300 yards at the 91st annual Highlanders indoor track meet Saturday.

Mays asked Andy Stanfield, a New York neighbor to help him prepare for the meet. Stanfield set the Canadian open record of 32.1 for the 300 yards here in 1953.

The strategy paid off as Mays, a member of the Grand Street Boys Club, ran the distance in 31.9 seconds.

The Ottawa Uplands Harriers shared the spotlight with Mays by chopping one-tenth of a second off the Canadian open native record of 50 seconds during a heat in the women's 440-yard relay.

The Ottawa team of Barbara Dallimore, Penny Werthner, Irene Harris and Joan Fisher won the final in 50.4.

Herb Washington, a 17-year-old school student from Flint, Mich., caused some excitement when he ran the 50-yard dash in 5.1 seconds, the world record time, during a semifinal heat. He won the event with a 5.2 in the final.

However, the International Amateur Athletic Federation does not recognize indoor marks.

More than 950 athletes from Canada and the United States competed in the 23-event meet.

Edwin Roberts of Baltimore Md. finished second to Washington in the 50-yard dash with a time of 5.4 and second in the men's 300 yards.

In the men's 1,000-yard event, Byron Tyce, a Jamaican at New York University, edged Bill Crothers of Markham, Ont.

Tyce finished in two minutes, 9.9 seconds with Crothers clocking 2:10.4. The two had split two decisions in previous meetings at 1,000 yards.

Frank Tomeo of the New York Athletic Club set a meet record of 1:11.4 in the men's 600-yard dash, finishing ahead of David Pemery of Boston.

Sam Bair of Kent State University, Ohio, won the mile in 4:08.1. He was followed by Peter Ross of Boston University and Bill Ripple of Buffalo.

Brian Donnelly of Toronto set a Canadian native record at the 60-yard hurdles with a time of 6.1. The record had been 6.2.

Rick MacDonald of Toronto broke the Canadian junior record in a hurdles semi-final with a time of 6.7 seconds.

An Ancaster, Ont., high school team of Ian Miller, Bob Inglis, George Rioux and Laurie Robinson broke the record of 3:49.3 with a time of 3:47.4 in the junior mile medley relay.
