

Washington, Wallace Set Track Marks

MANSFIELD, Ohio — Central High's Herb Washington and Northern's William Wallace put on a dazzling personal duel in the 37th annual Mansfield Relays Saturday.

In the process, they both shattered Jesse Owens' records for the 100 and 200-yard dashes. Washington will have his name recorded as one record holder while they'll share the honor for the other.

Washington ran the 100 in 9.4, knocking two seconds off the previous record shared by Cleveland East Tech's Owens (1933) and Eddie Hearne, Toronto Neil McNeil, Canada (1966).

Wallace finished third with a 9.5 clocking and a new record for a Northern High trackster. Washington's time tied his personal record set in the U.S. Jaycee Junior Track and Field championships held at Des Moines, Iowa, last year. But he was aided with a 10.7 miles per hour breeze. Both times are city records under windless conditions.

In the 220, the pair broke Owens' 1933 time of 21.2 when they came in with identical 21.0 timings during the semi-final run. Washington won in the finals with 21.1.

Northern's shuttle relay team gave Flint another record with a 55.5 showing. Mansfield Senior (1931) and Ohio's Warren Harding (1967) held the old record of 56.2. Wallace, Theodor Perry, Willie Polk and Eugene Lee made up the quartet.

Other Flint placers were Central's Russ Carson, third in the high jump with 6-4 1/4; Lee, fourth in the pole vault with 14-feet and Clio's Steve Gorsalitz, fourth in the mile with 4:25.5.

Central finished third in the meet with 15 points while Northern was tied for fifth with 11. Pontiac Central and Cleveland John F. Kennedy tied for first with 16.

Fans will have an opportunity to watch Washington and Wallace meet head on when Central and Northern collide at Dort Field
