

# Flint Sprinter Shatters Marks

MANSFIELD, Ohio (AP)— A Flint, Mich., speedster has shattered the two remaining records set by Olympic great Jesse Owens in the Mansfield Relays some 35 years ago.

Herb Washington, 17-year-old flash from Flint Central High School, cracked marks in the 100- and 220-yard dashes set by Owens when he was a track star at Cleveland East Tech in 1933.

Washington, a 6-foot-1, 188-pounder, sped through the 100 Saturday night in 9.4 seconds, bettering Owens' mark of 9.6. In the preliminaries, Washington and Willie Wallace of Flint, Mich., Northern High each were

clocked at 21.0 in the 220. They bettered Owens' time by two-tenths of a second.

Although Dwight Walls of Ypsilanti did not win, he still set a Ypsilanti High record. He placed third in the 440-yard dash with a :49.6 clocking.

The Braves' 880-yard relay team gained a third place.

Pontiac, Mich., Central and Cleveland Kennedy each tied for first place in team honors with 16 points.

Flint Northern collected 11 points to tie for third with Cleveland Glenville. Ecorse, Mich., was ninth with 10 points, and Dearborn, Mich., was 10th with 9 points.
