

# Miss Kraker Sets Pair Of Records

**YPSILANTI** — Once upon a time the cry in the world of baseball was—"Break up the Yankees."

In the not-too-distant future a similar outcry could be raised in women's track and field circles with the Michigammes as its target.

The Michigammes, who have dominated state competition in both cross country and track during the last several months, put together another outstanding display of strength and depth to win the state AAU Indoor Track and Field Championship against 26 rivals on the EMU campus during the weekend.

Michigammes' mastery was so complete the southeastern Michigan club, coached by Ken and Betty Simmons of Ann Arbor, had but one serious challenger. The Detroit Track Club with a runnerup score of 94 points.

The Michigammes, despite the absence of two top squad members, Janis Brown and Mary Hokanson, out with injuries, easily won with a total of 122 points while Lincoln Park was a distant third with 52 points.

Two new records were set, both by Ann Arbor's Francie Kraker. The Michigan student flashed to an 880-yard victory in 2:13.5, lowering the previous mark of 2:17.8, and clipped 1½ seconds from the previous 1500-meter record of 4:47.5.

Susan Dudley, who won the National Girls 880 championship a week earlier, also bettered the old half-mile mark in finishing second on a 2:15.8 clocking. The 16-year old speedster also took fourth in the 1500-meter event.

The Michigammes had two other firsts, Cindy Jones in the shot put and Karen Rehman in the 440-yard run, plus six seconds, three thirds, five fourths, and one fifth-place in placing in all events except hurdles where leading threat Janis Brown did not compete.
