

# Central, Northern Rate High In Two Weekend Track Meets

Two track championships for Flint are possible tonight and Saturday.

It's also possible that Flint will get no championship but the division of teams for two meets gives Central and Northern chances for titles in the 17th annual Central Michigan University indoor meet and the fifth annual Lansing State Journal Spartan Relays at Michigan State University.

**CENTRAL WILL** be one of 75 teams in the Class A portion of the Lansing meet on Saturday. Northern is one of 15 schools in the Central Michigan meet tonight.

Both must be considered title possibilities on the basis of last Saturday's indoor meet at Ypsilanti where Central ranked second and Northern tied for third in a similar meet.

Central faces a major hurdle because Battle Creek Central, 1967 state Class A champ, is in the Lansing field. Northern's major rival will be Pontiac Central, winner of last week's Ypsilanti

**THERE'S A "new look"** at Mount Pleasant because Central will be absent for the first time since the meet began as the Saginaw-Arthur Hill Invitational. Ironically, the two schools which started the meet in 1952 also are on the sidelines because Saginaw public schools have no spring sports.

## N. Dakota Coach In Job Change.

**DULUTH, Minn. (AP) —** William G. Selman, University of North Dakota hockey coach the past two seasons, was named today head hockey coach at the University of Minnesota-Duluth.

As North Dakota's head hockey coach, Selman led the Sioux to a combined record of 39 victories, 20 defeats and 3 ties. Selman took the Sioux to the National Collegiate Athletic Association tournament both years he was at North Dakota.

Central's Herb Washington equaled the Lansing record for the 60-yard dash in 6.2 seconds last year while Northern's Gene Lee pole vaulted 13 feet, one-half inch for the record at Mount Pleasant. The Vikings' William Wallace and Fred Blackmon were members of the winning 1967 six-lap relay team.

Tonight's meet begins at 5:45. Saturday's meet has preliminaries at noon with finals at 6.
