# World Records In Jeopardy

YPSILANTI — "I can almost guarantee there will be at least two world records set Saturday."

So says Richard Beyst, AAU meet director, as he reviews what is certain to rank as one of the premier women's track and field events of the season.

Starting at noon, a major cross-section of top distaff thin-clads from throughout the Midwest and Ontario gather for National AAU competition at Eastern Michigan's Bowen Fieldhouse. Among leading contenders are the Ann Arbor-based Michigammas and the Wolverines, composed mainly of athletes from the Detroit area.

Neither, however, are in favorite's role—that's reserved for the Mayor Daley Track Club of Chicago.

Veteran Olympian Willye White, the nation's top distaff long jumper, leads the Chicago group with her closest competition expected to come from Dearborn's Sheila Owens.

Ann Arbor's Francie Kraker, who has previously won world honors, will vie in the mile and 880-yard runs while other leading distance competitors include Cheryl Bridges, a participant at the recent World Games in Scotland, and Gayle Olinek.

Among other Ann Arbor threats will be Carol Schleede, an AAU state age-group champion, who will vie in the 440 along with Ypsilanti's Sue Parks.

Miss Parks recently established the fastest 880-yard age-group record in the U.S., 2:23 flat but favored over the half-mile distance is Ohio's Vicki Slater, considered one of America's future Olympic prospects.

The indoor hurdles, where Mamie Rallins is favored, is one of the events where Beyst sees a world record in the offing while the other mark is predicted in a lesser-known event, the women's walk, where Jeanie Bocci, tops in the U.S., will seek half-mile honors.

The mile run is also seen as a likely world mark possibility as is the women's shot, where Marian Seider, rated first in the U.S. is the odds-on favorite.
