

Miss Kraker Wins 1500-Meter Event

HAZEL PARK—The Michigammas have proved they can win in the mud as well as on dry land.

Paced in the field events by Cindy Jones and Louise Gerrish, and by Francie Kraker, Susan Dudley, and Liz Caldwell in the running events, the Ann Arbor-based women's track and field organization led a field of 23 teams in the first annual Tri-State Invita-

tional Track and Field Championships.

Miss Kraker won the 1500-meter in 4:51.4 and anchored

the 800 medley relay team with a .58.4 leg in one of the most thrilling races of the day.

Despite rain throughout much of the day, the Michigammas collected 56 points to easily outdistance their nearest rival, the Mayor Daley Youth Club from Chicago, by 18 points in the open division while the Canton, Ohio, club was third with a total of 32 points.

In addition to the 15-year old Miss Caldwell, the meet saw a double winner in the Chicago Club's Mamie Rollins, a two-time Olympian who coped the 80 and 200 meter hurdles events.

Susan Dudley gave the

Michigammas a first place in the 800-meter run, 2:24, while Cindy Jones scored a victory in the shot put, 36-3, and Louise Gerrish won the javelin, 148-3.

Other Michigammas points were scored by: Joyce Soth, third in shot put and fifth in discus; Cindy Jones, discus, second; Joan Perry, third in discus and second in javelin; Janie Schulte, fourth in the 1500 meters and fourth in the 880; Francie Kraker, third in the 440; Alice Steinicke, fourth in the 440.

Carol Schlede, who recently celebrated her 12th birthday, displayed the potential for a brilliant track future by winning the girls 440 dash in 66 seconds flat, faster than any of her 14 through 17-year-old rivals by more than a second and a half.
