### CLARK LEADS NEW HAVEN TO THIRD

# Unionville "D" Track Champ

MOUNT PLEASANT (AP) — Showing a consistent balance mostly in field events, DeWitt captured the Class C crown and Unionville the Class D championship in the State High School Track and Field Meet at Mount Pleasant Saturday.

DeWitt, a town of less than 2,000 population in Clinton County in central Lower Michigan, compiled 41 points, finishing nine ahead of second-place Akron Fairgrove.

The Class C champion had second-place finishes in the 220-yard dash and the 880-yard relay and took third in the 440-yard run and the mile relay.

Unionville, which has less than 1,000 residents, and is located in Michigan's thumb area, finished among the top three in six events to breeze to a Class D team victory with 43 points. Way back in second were Mendon and Pentwater, which had 29 points each.

Unionville took a first in the 880-yard relay, seconds in the two-mile run and the 120-yard run, and thirds in the 220-yard dash, 100-yard dash and the pole vault.

In Class C, new state records

were set in three events and tied in another.

In the long jump, Mike Clark of New Haven leaped 22 feet, 6¾ inches to tie the record set by Doug Smith of Traverse City St. Joseph in 1967. Clark also took second in the 100-yard dash.

ANN ARBOR (AP) — Bucking a stiff headwind, Flint Central's highly-touted sprinter Herb Washington breezed to victory in the 100-yard dash and the 220-yard dash in the State Class A high school track championships Saturday.

But the team spotlight fell upon Battle Creek Central, whose depth from several heavily-experienced seniors proved enough to win the class championship.

EAST LANSING (AP) — Bay City John Glenn, a school that has been competing in varsity track for only three years, won the Class B State High School Track and Field Meet team title at East Lansing Saturday without taking a single first place.

"We did it strictly on team depth," said coach Bob Beau-

mont. "We are a great bunch of fellows who work well together."

Detroit East Catholic placed second with 36 points, Kalamazoo Hackett was third with 35½, Grand Rapids Central fourth with 33, and Detroit St. Anthony fifth with 21.

Port Huron High's Jerry Nichols scored eight points for the Big Reds in Class A competition as he placed fifth in both the high jump and long jump.

Nichols cleared 6-foot-3, a half-inch short of his school record in the high jump and posted his longest jump ever 22-foot-6¾ in the long jump. The leap coincidentally was exactly as long as the mark New Haven's Clark used to win in Class C and the two boys now share the lead on the Times Herald honor roll in that event.

Unionville's top efforts in winning the "D" title came from its winning 880-yard relay team of Art Alegria, Terry Houthoofd, Jim Weber and Steve Sattler with a 1:34.9 time. Ray Androl placed second in the two-mile run in 10:13.9. Sattler was third

in the 100-yard dash at :10.4 and third in the 220-yard dash at :23.1 and Dennis Colon tied for third in the pole vault at 11-feet-8.

Akron-Fairgrove in gaining the runner-up spot in Class C got a winning effort in the 880-yard dash by Charles Brink of 2:01.2. The Vikings mile relay team of Mike Kruchkow, Tom Spencer, Dave Arnold, and Brink won in 3:31.8 and Ralf Reichenbach placed second in the shot put at 53-feet-6.

Mayville's Clare Kreger took third in the two-mile run at 10:07.1 as his team scored eight points.

Al Currey of Almont tied for second in the long jump behind Clark with a leap of 21-feet-4. The Raiders scored 12 points in the finals.

Yale's Scott Richards scored four points for the Bulldogs.

Vassar's Bob Frye helped Vassar score 18 points for the best showing by an area Class B school. Frye won the shot put at 55-feet-10¼ and placed third in the 100-yard dash in 10.1 seconds.

Imlay City scored five points in the meet and Laker High three.
