

# Baldwin's Fastest Two Mile Is State Class B Mark

**EAST LANSING** — Bendie's Paul Baldwin was the only Flint representative to win a first in the state Class B track meet Saturday at Rbert H. Young Field, but he set a record in the process.

The lanky 5-10 senior, who finished second in the two mile last year, recorded a 9:40.4 clocking, eclipsing 7.8 seconds from the record set last year by Wyoming-Rogers' Norman Cepela.

**BAY CITY** John Glenn won the championship with 42 points. Detroit East Catholic finished second with 36 and Kalamazoo-Hackett third with 35½.

Flint area's best team showings were Bendle 8, Bentley 6, Hamady 6, Montrose 4, Lakeville 2, Linden 1 and Swartz Creek ½.

Baldwin, who ran the two mile in 10:03 last year, led almost the entire race. In the final lap, second-place finisher Bill Chenoweth, Charlotte, assumed a short lead. But Baldwin's strong finishing kick earned a comfortable margin.

"THAT'S THE FASTEST I've ever run," said the 140-pounder after the race.

Hamady's Bill Taylor, who finished 10th in 1967, earned third in the pole vault at 13-1. Northville's Ron Gloetzner won the event at 13-7, breaking the old record of 13-6 set by Bill Bekkering, Fremont, in 1966. It was one of three records set.

A big disappointment was Rich Good's fifth-place showing. The Montrose star won the event last year with a 13-6 but only went 12-8 Saturday.

**LAKEVILLE'S** Jim Morton continued his progressive improvement with seventh place at 12-8. He recorded his best vault at 12-6 in the regional meet last week. Swartz Creek's Bob Root tied for eighth.

Bentley's Keith Cox grabbed third in the shot put with a heave of 53-6½. Vassar's Bob Frye, who collected 18 points, won the shot at 55-10½.

Frye finished third in the 100 and fifth in the 220. Imlay City's Chester Marcol was fourth in the long jump.

**LINDEN'S** Thad Cook was impressive in the 100-yard dash preliminaries. He won his heat at 10.2 and finished second in the semifinals with the same time.

He was eighth in the finals in 10.3.

The championship wasn't decided until the final event, the one-mile relay. Detroit East Catholic was leading with 36

points, followed by Kalamazoo-Hackett's 35 and BC John Glenn's 33.

**JOHN GLENN** came through with a second and nine big points in the event. It was the first time it has won a meet in its two-year history.

The final record came in the 180 low hurdles when Mike Whitfield ran 19.3. The old record of 19.5 was set by Willow Run's Lamar Miller in 1964.

## Two JC Netters, Golf Team Eye National Titles

Junior College's conference championship golf team and two tennis players have received permission to participate in national tournaments.

Coach Don Jarrard and golfers Mike Adams, Dennis Biller, Mert Goode, Mark Henrickson and Tom Kehoe will go to Roswell, N.M., and the No. 1 doubles team of Rick Niemi and Charles Braden will go to Ocala, Fla., for tournaments.

Flint had a 17-1-1 during the regular golf season and last Monday annexed the Michigan JC Conference title at Atlas Valley. The NJCAA golf meet will be hosted by New Mexico Military Institute, on June 4-7.

Niemi and Braden were runners-up in the Michigan JC Conference individual championships, eliminating two seeded duos before losing. They'll also compete in singles in the national meet.
