

**St. Francis Scores**

**Washington Runs '100'  
In 9.6 At Chip Relays**

Flint Central, Cranbrook, Detroit Country Day and Unionville were Class A, B, C, D winners in the Central Michigan Relays which attracted a total of 183 schools in a two-day meet Friday and Saturday on the CMU campus. The Class B and D phase of the meet was held Friday with the Class A and C teams taking the field on Saturday.

Both Traverse City Central and Traverse City St. Francis took part in Saturday's meet with the Gladiators sharing 17th place among the 35 teams which placed in the scoring column. The St. Francis squad finished the meet with six points, all coming on a fourth place in the two-mile relay. Running in this event were Joe Messing, Larry Truelove, Ed Smith and Cal Sheehy. Three new Relay records were set in the Class C division.

The Trojans drew a blank in the fast Class A competition, the highlight of which was a new record in the 100 yard dash. The old mark, set a year ago by Herb Washington of Flint Central was 9.8 seconds. Saturday he coasted in with a five yard lead over his nearest competitor in 9.6 seconds. It would appear that a new mark for this event will be a certainty in the state finals if he can get a break in wind conditions. Four new marks were set in

the meet which found 23 schools breaking into the scoring column.

In the Class D competition, area athletes who placed among the leaders included Roger Connelly, of Brethren who tied for third in the pole vault, took a fourth in the 100 and won the high jump; the Lake City mile relay team which won this event, Freesoil taking fifth; and Brethren's 440 yard relay team which took second.

In Class C, Gaylord's Tom Hubbard was the winner in the pole vault with a 13 foot 1/2 inch vault; with Ralph Doan of Charlevoix taking a second in the high hurdles.

Central's Trojans will compete in the Soo Invitational Wednesday at American Soo, then compete in the LMAC-GRCL-VCC meet at Grand Haven Friday.

St. Francis is defending champion in the Huron Straits Conference meet at Petoskey Saturday.

The top five teams in the Class A final standings were Flint Central with 47 points, Pontiac Central 43, Flint Northern 38, Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills 28 and Detroit Thurston 20.

Trailing Detroit Country Day in Class C were Shepherd 31 points, Akron - Fairgrove 28, Flint St. Agnes 28 and Mayville 24 points.
