

Local JC Track Entrants Win

SALINE—Three qualifiers from the Lansing eliminations came up winners here Saturday in the state Jaycee Junior Champions track and field meet.

Adolph Burton, a Sexton High School trackman, and Rob Carr, who plies his trade at Everett in the spring, both annexed wins in the intermediate division. Gary Van Elst, Middleville's brilliant shotputter, won in the senior bracket.

Burton captured the 220-yard dash with a time of 23.5 seconds. Carr swept over the 120-yard high hurdles in 16.3. Burton also placed in two other events, earning fourth in the high jump and 5-8, and fifth in the long jump with 19-9/4.

Van Elst, best prep shot-putter in Michigan history, recorded a winning toss of 59-10 1/2. He, along with the other senior division winners, will compete in the Jaycee national meet at Eugene, Ore., in August.

Three other local athletes earned high places in senior events. Jake Snell, an East Lansing prep, cleared 6-0 to place second in the high jump, and was fourth in the mile run with a 4:36.2 clocking.

State Class C dash champion Jim Holmes of BTS was timed in 10.1 while placing second in the 100, and 23.3 for fourth in the 220.

Marv Lynch, an Everett trackman, took third in the 440 at 51.8.

In the Intermediate bracket, Terry Mohre cleared 10-6 to place fourth in the pole vault, and Mike O'Leary heaved the discus 87-6 for fifth place.
