

Michigan Repeats as Track Champ

EUGENE, Ore. — Michigan successfully defended its title here Saturday in the United States Jaycee Junior track and field championships winning four firsts and a second and piling up 48 points.

Louisiana was second with 34 points while California and Washington tied for third with 32 points. Thirty-eight states participated in the meet.

Larry Biskner, Michigan high school pole vault champion from Waterford, won his specialty with a leap of an even 15 feet. Other Michigan winners were John Morrison, Willie Polk and John Mann.

Morrison, a senior at Redford Union High, won the 120-yard high hurdles in :14.3 seconds; Polk, from Flint Northern, captured the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds flat while Mann, of Farmington, won the high jump with a leap of 6 feet 7 inches. Bob Woodroof, of Rochester, picked up a second for Michigan in the 220-yard dash.
