## Bentley Dominates Montrose Meet

What was intended to be a sneak preview of the County B League track season turned into a nightmare for six schools.

Although the league meet is still a month away, Bentley appeared to be in a class by itself Wednesday after its awesome showing in the fifth annual Montrose Relays.

Mert. Wallace's Bulldogs had seven first places in the 12 events while compiling 84 points. That total was only one and one-half shy of Fenton's record output in 1967. Last year's champion, Swartz Creek, had 62 points.

FRESHMEN - dominated LakeVille finished a surprising second with 55 points, four better than host Montrose. Hamady was fourth with 34 Bendle (24), followed Durand (16) and Atherton

In the nine running events, Bentley had two second-place ribbons to go along with the seven winners.

Senior Ron Maygar was one of many key performers for the Bulldogs. He won the high jump in 5-10 and ran the opening leg of three relay victories.

fying with the event narrowing down to Maygar and Montrose's Bill Cornel.

Cornel cleared 5-8 on his first try while Maygar needed two cracks. But the Bentley ace easily cleared the 5-10 mark on his second attempt while Cornel failed in four tri-

Bentley's Jim Penney, the individual champ in last fall's County B cross - country meet, proved a strong finisher on the longer relays.

HE ANCHORED THE distance medley team and turned defeat into victory by

overhauling an opponet with 220 yards left. At that point, Penney went into the final leg a good 50 yards behind and still managed to breeze home
