# Hackett Races to Lopsided Victory in Hastings Relays

**HASTINGS** — Kalamazoo Hackett High School scored firsts in the four running events and another in the high jump to win the 28th annual Hastings Relays Saturday.

Perfect weather was evident as two new marks were set and three others came within less than a second of being broken.

The Kalamazoo parochial school won its first Hastings Relays title by totaling 48 points, well ahead of second place St. Joseph, which finished with 37½ points.

Charlotte's brother combination of Jim and Bill Chenweth

and Terry and Tom Bytwert set a new mark of 8:24.8 in the two-mile relay, breaking the old mark of 8:26.9, set by Battle Creek Central in 1965.

Kurt Dunn of Portage Northern established a new record in the long jump with a leap of 22 feet, 5½ inches, bettering the old record of 22 feet, 4 inches, made by Howard Jackson of Bangor in 1962.

Plainwell's distance medley relay of Greg Chappell, Jim Brown, Tom Morrell and Mike Wood took a first to help boost the Trojans into a tie with Pennfield for seventh place, with 15½ points apiece.

Teams representing Class A,

B and C were sprinkled among the 19 schools which entered this colorful event.

Defending champion Portage Northern finished third with 31 points, followed by Portage Central with 27, Charlotte 21, Harper Creek 20, Plainwell and Pennfield with 15½ each, Coldwater 14, St. Johns 8, Lakewood 7, Kalamazoo Christian 4, Middleville 3, Gull Lake 2, and Springfield 1½. Hastings, Grand Ledge, Ionia and Marshall failed to score.

In other good times the 440-yard relay team of Mike Whitfield, Mark Bundle, Amos Jones and Jim Holmes of Kalamazoo Hackett ran the event in :44.6, six-tenths of a second off the mark of :44.

Kalamazoo Hackett ran another fast relay in the 880 as Whitfield, John Dixon, Len Schelb and Holmes toured the track in 1:39.9, three-tenths off the mark of 1:39.3.

Portage Central's team of Mike Murray, Kurt Dunn, Tom Morren and Mitch Garvey just missed a meet mark in the sprint medley in 2:33.5, four-tenths off the mark of 2:33.1.

**ROME (AP)** — Determined Tony Roche and angry John Newcombe, the top-seeded pros from Australia, took different routes Saturday as they advanced to the semifinals of the Italian International Open Tennis Tournament.

Roche, the No. 1 seed, wore down Cliff Drysdale of South Africa 6-4, 4-6, 6-0, 7-5 with little display of emotion. Newcombe, the No. 2 seed, had it easier in a 7-5, 6-4, 6-0 victory over Martin Mulligan of Italy, but several times burst into angry displays.

Roche and Newcombe joined Friday's two winners—Tom Okker of the Netherlands and Jan Kodes of Czechoslovakia—in the semifinals.
