

# East Catholic, H

MARYSVILLE — Detroit East Catholic became the first Class C track team in the 11-year history of the Marysville Relays to outscore all the teams entered here Saturday.

East Catholic's speed netted four firsts in the all-relay meet and brought them 63 points. Holly scored 65 points to win its second Class B title with host Marysville turning in its best point performance ever with 54 points for second in "B."

ST. CLAIR, which will be battling the Vikings for honors in the St. Clair Area League, used its sprint speed to capture third place with 43 points, edging Bullock Creek which scored 42. Holly last won the "B" title at the Marysville Relays in 1963.

Defending champion Cranbrook did not compete. The championship for East Catholic was its first after placing among the top teams in the Class B state meet last year.

Coach Jim MacDougall's team ran away from the "C"

competition with only Flint St. Agnes, 28 points, hitting double figures. New Haven, defending champion from the Southern Thumb Association, managed only four points for sixth place lacking its usual depth.

East Catholic was in on one of the two record changes for the bright, beautiful day at Marysville Park.

The sprint medley relay team of Stan Sanders, Jim Carruthers, Al Jones, and Keith Jones was clocked in 2:31.2 over the 440, 220, 220, 440-yard race.

The old mark was set in 1960 by Ecorse at 2:34.5.

Harper Woods snapped the year-old record of Monroe Catholic Central in the Marysville relay (110, 330, 220 and 440 yards) in 2:06.5 with the team of Al Tunis, Nick Billardello, Terry Donley and Al Davis.

In fact, fifth place New Haven tied the old record of 2:10.4. Six new events were listed this year with all four field events being run in relays. Marysville took full advantage

of the relay system in the field events, winning the long jump in spectacular fashion. All three boys, Gary Scheffler, Phil Smith and Max Bromley, topped 20 feet to edge Holly.

Smith and Bromley each traveled 20-foot-4 and Scheffler hit 20-foot-1/2. None had topped 20 feet yet this season.

Scheffler and Smith were outstanding for the Vikings in the field events. Scheffler cleared 5-foot-8 in the high jump, 11-foot-6 in the pole vault and ran a leg of the shuttle high hurdles. Smith went 5-foot-6 in the high jump and ran on the shuttle high and low hurdles.

Marysville was fourth in the high jump and pole vault and second in the shot put with the team of Doug Goodin, Ron Kulkula and Don Goniwicha all topping 40-feet.

The Vikings also scored in both hurdle relays, the two-mile and middle distance relays.

St. Clair made an impressive showing in the sprints. The team of Mike Metz, Tom Skuta, Don Lozon and Gary Howison won the 440-yard dash in 45.6 seconds, just three-tenths of a second off the record set in 1967 by Cranbrook.

The Saints' sprinters also gained a second in the 880-yard relay to East Catholic, were third in the Marysville relay and the mile relay team was second.

East Catholic took three other firsts in addition to its record mark. They established a standard in the new shuttle high hurdles of 1:05.8 with Larry Hill, Jesse Godfrey and Jim Kelly also running on the winning shuttle low hurdle team.

East Catholic speedsters also wrapped up the 880-yard relay with Al Jones and Jim Carruthers repeat winners from he record sprint medley team.

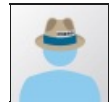
