Pontiac Central Rules Meet

MOUNT PLEASANT (AP) — Final team point standings for Pontiac Central High School won its fourth straight title Friday in the annual invitational Class A meet held at Central Michigan University.

Only one record was broken this year when Mike Murphy of Midland ran the 440-yard dash, capturing first place in the event with a 49.7 second timing. The previous record was set in 1961 by Bullet Edwards of Flint Northern at 52.2.

Final team point standings were: Pontiac Central, 47; Midland, 31; Flint Northern, 20; Flint Kearsley, 18; Pontiac Northern, 16; Saginaw, 12; Bay City Handy, 10; Muskegon, 10; Bay City Central, 9; Owosso, 9; Saginaw MacArthur, 6; Waterford Kettering, 6; Waterford Township, 5; Mt. Pleasant 4; Muskegon Mona Shores, 3; Traverse City, 2; Saginaw Arthur Hill, 0.

Individual winners included Tom Levensgood of Bay City Handy with a 10:00.1 clocking in the two mile; Willie Polk of Flint Northern with 6.3 in the 60-yard dash; John Jackson of Midland in the 65-yard high hurdles.

Other winners were Pontiac Central's John Costello in the mile run with 4:30.2; Polk again in the 65-yard low hurdles in 7.2; Kevin Reabe of Waterford Kettering with 2:03.9 in the 880; and Horace Davis of Pontiac Central in the broad jump at 21-2½.

Also winning were Pontiac Central's John Ray with a 52-1½ shotput; Campy Russell of Pontiac Central, Bob Deer of Owosso and Mel Reeves of Pontiac Northern all at 6-1 in the high jump and Saginaw Douglas MacArthur's Jeff Dennis with 13-3¼ in the pole vault.

Team event winners were Saginaw in the six-lap relay with 1:58.3; and Midland in the medley relay at 5:58.
