Track Title To Kettering

Kettering High won a second straight Class A regional track title Saturday in the rain at Fitzgerald High but the day belonged to the individuals.

Doug Brown, a senior at Notre Dame who "had never run so fast in my life," turned in a blazing 4:18.4 mile and Ronnie Phillips, who doubles as a basketball star at Denby, won the half mile in 1:03.6, less than a second off the state record.

BROWN, WHO ran up the track at Mansfield and his season, ran strong and hard. There was no one to push him as there will be next week in the state finals at East Lansing.

"Until I beat Jerry Skakel of St. Anthony I'm still the second best runner in my own league," said Brown. "I'm happy to have done so well but I've still got a long way to go."

Kettering piled up 37 points to 20 for second place Grosse Pointe North, winning three events and scoring in nine of the 14 events.

Dearborn Rules

Dearborn High in Class A and Detroit East Catholic in Class C won regional track titles Saturday at Schuler High.

Dearborn got a 1:54.3 half mile from Bob May, Bill Franklin of Southgate won the quartermile in 49 seconds flat and Steve Danforth of Detroit turned in a sparkling 4:18.2 mile.

East Catholic won four first places in easily winning in Class C. The Warriors were state Class B runnerup last year.
