

Redford Union Wins State 'A' Track Title

EAST LANSING — Redford Union High, a Class A school which never before had won a state championship in any sport, captured the 1969 State track and field title on sunny Ralph Young Field here Saturday.

Six performers did it for

the Panthers, who only three years ago qualified just one man for the same meet.

HURDLER John Morrison was the big star for RU, although he had been suffering with cramps all week long. He won the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.3 seconds, finished second in the 180-yard lows and ran a leg on the 880-

yard relay team which wound up fifth.

Morrison accounted for 161/2 of his team's 29 points.

Defending champion Battle Creek Central finished second with 24 points, followed by Southgate and Pontiac Northern with 22 points each, Pontiac Central 21, Mackenzie 20 and Flint Central 18.

Two Detroit-area youngsters accounted for the only records set on a soft and sluggish track.

Mike Holt, the Henry Ford High quartermiler, won his specialty for the second straight year, capturing the 440 in the record time of 48.3 as he knocked half a second off his own state mark.

KEVIN REABE, the junior from Waterford Kettering, became the first state champion from his school when he won
