

Flint Has Two Individual C-D Champs

MOUNT PLEASANT — Michigan School for the Deaf Coach Earl Roberts has learned to live without hearing.

But he'd be in a fix if he couldn't talk about his talented sophomore Eddie Robinson.

Robinson was the toast of the Tartier team Saturday at the Class C and D running of the state track meet. The meet produced his best times of the season and made Roberts look forward to the next

two years with optimism.

ROBINSON won the 100, placed in the 220 and ran the anchor leg on the third place 880 relay team to personally account for 16 2/3 of his team's 24 points.

That wasn't enough to make a serious team bid for the title which went to Grass Lake which scored 55 points. Roberts was pleased with the fifth-place finish.

Holy Rosary, which pushed MSD to the regional title last Saturday at Dort Field, finished 10th and St. John Vianney vaulted into 16th place on the strength of a second-place finish in the mile relay.

The winner totaled 44 points to beat out Sheppard which had the meet's outstanding individual in Bill White who scored 22 1/2 points. White won the highs and lows for the second straight year.

The long day produced only three records and tied another because of an aiding wind in the sprints. Robinson had the best qualifying 220 time of 22.4 and was second in the 100 in 10.3 which were his best efforts of the season.

ROBERTS would have been happy with a third place finish by Robinson in the 100 but Robinson got a perfect start and led all the way to win by a yard in 10 flat.

The time compared to the record of 10.2. Robinson also had a good start in the 220 but tired midway through the race. His second place time also bettered the 220 record but was disallowed because of the wind.

Hoffman also had his best times of the year and was in good company in both hurdles in which White was in a class by himself.

HOLY ROSARY'S Phil Lewis ran a strong 440, finishing second. He nearly fell in a tight race for second place in the last 10 yards.

Teammate Mark Kuyawa finished fifth in the two-mile.
