

State Champs Lead In Detroit Prep Meet

A couple of newly crowned state champions made the big news Tuesday as the Public School League opened its track and field championships. Over on the East Side North-ern's Marshall Dill, 4-foot-7 $\frac{1}{2}$, and only a 15-year-old sophomore, limped to a 10-second flat 100-yard dash and a 22.2-second 220.

Mike Holt, two-time state quarter-mile champion, became a sprinter as the West Side got his qualifying underway. Holt will try to win both sprints for Henry Ford.

Dill's right leg was heavily taped with elastic. "He pulled a muscle feeling around in intramural basketball," said coach Woodrow Thomas after Dill limped back to the finish line following the 100. "I hope I don't have to scratch him out of the 220."

Dill said he wanted to run the 220 where he won the state title only last Saturday at East Lansing, and he captured both his qualifying heats handily. The injury, however, forced his coach to give up all hope of entering him in the broad jump.

Holt qualified in both the 100 and 220 at Henry Ford High. In Thursday's West Side finals, Holt will have to face state champion Kenny James of Mackenzie, among others.

East and West Side finals start Thursday at 3:30 p.m. at both Pershing and Henry Ford schools. The city championships are slated next week at Henry Ford.
