## Parkside, Chelsea Track Champs 2nd Week in Row

Jackson area high school trackmen made an impressive showing at the 29th annual Dale R. Sprankle Albion College Invitational Saturday, winning two team championships and taking three runnersup honors.

Parkside of coach Dave Fultz won Class 2 with 39 points and Chelsea of coach Bert Kruse took Class 4 with 40 points. East Jackson of coach Bill Fitch and Grass Lake of coach Phil Desper, both defending champions, were runnersup also with Albion. EJ was second in Class 5 with 37 points to champ Detroit Nativity's 44. Grass Lake was runnerup in Class 6 with 42 points to Athens' 43. The Warriors led 42-38 going into the final event, the mile relay, but failed to place while Athens won and gained five points. Albion had 38 points behind St. Joseph's 61 in Class 3. Jackson was 10th in Class 1 with 12 points, Lumen Christi 10th in Class 3 with eight, Northwest 10th in Class 5 with six and Springport fifth in Class 5 with six and Springport fifth in Class 6 with 23, and North Adams and Litchfield tied for eighth with five.
