

Chelsea Thinclads Win At Albion

CHELSEA—The Chelsea High track team really made a strong showing in the Albion Relays by winning Section Four of the multi-team meet.

The Bulldogs scored 40 points while Battle Creek Harper Creek was second on 34. Harper Woods finished third on 21½. Saline scored 11 points while Dexter got 7.

Rick Slane was a double winner for Chelsea as he took the long jump at 20 feet 11 inches and then won the 220-yard dash in :23.6. He was also second in the 100-yard dash at :10.6.

Mike McGinn also was a first place winner by taking the 800-yard run at 2:02.6 while Doug Weatherwax won the mile run at 4:38.9, a new school record.

The two relay teams placed second. The 800-yard relay of Larry Gorton, Jim Wojcicki, Ted Bennett and Mike Schnadt was clocked in 1:35.5 while the mile unit of Wojcicki, Weatherwax, Schnadt and McGinn stopped the watches in 3:35.3.

Bennett got a third in the 220-yard dash at :24 while Jim Boylan was fourth in the shot put on 45 feet 4 inches. Jim Wojcicki and Larry Blackwell were fourth and fifth, respectively, in

the pole vault after clearing 12 feet. Mike Barland gained a fifth in the two-mile run for Saline while Keith Smith finished fourth in the 100-yard dash and second in the 220-yard dash. Gary Ernst got a second place in the shot put.

Dexter was led by Gary Klapperich, who gained a second in the mile run, and Tim Snyder, who was third in the pole vault.
