Howell Thinclads Trample Holt

HOWELL—Howell won 10 of 14 events last Tuesday afternoon at Page Field to sweep the Holt, 66-52 in the Highlanders' first dual meet of the season. Steve Mark Alexander, Steve Hagman, and Gary Campbell were double winners for Howell.

Coach Sanford Hermin's squad jumped out to an early lead as they swept four firsts in the field events. Junior Steve Anderson won the shot put with a mighty heave of 45' 9³/₄". Jim Wheeler finished second at 41' 4¹/₂". The long jump was won by Gary Campbell in a most impressive 18' 11¹/₂". Randy Lynn, despite not being in top physical shape due to an early season injury, easily vaulted higher than anyone else. The high jump was won by Howell's Mark Alexander who cleared the bar at 5' 6".

The low hurdles were also won by Alexander who was clocked in 22.3 while teammate Charlie Yost hit 23.3 to finish third.

Steve Hagman swept the sprint events by recording a 10.6 in the 100 yard dash and a 23.8 in the 220. T. R. Rummier had little difficulty in winning the 440. This experienced senior pulled away from the field as he was timed in 52.8. Ted Herrst of Howell finished third in the 440.

"Si Hugo" Green of Holt set a school record in the half mile with a scorching time of 1:59.3 which was five seconds faster than Howell's Brian Williams who finished second.

Another Highlander win came in the two mile as Doug Cameron outclassed his opponents and finished in 10:31. Howell's Chip Blanchard finished second in the mile to give his team some insurance points.

The final Howell triumph on this balmy spring day came in the 880 relay which was run by Steve Hagman, Dave Farr, Charlie Yost, and Gary Campbell.

On Saturday, the Highlander thinclads journeyed to Mansfield, Ohio where Brian Williams turned in a 4:36 mile despite nearly freezing temperatures. Other than that, there is nothing to report from Mansfield.
