Northern Leads 1-2-3-4 Flint Finish in Regional

Viking Track Title Is First Since 1962

There was more than a trophy involved in Northern High's march to the regional track championship Friday night at Houston Stadium.

Tradition and rah-rah have been watered down in the era of protest and dissent but any orthern old timer could feel that maybe Friday's triumph signalled a return to the period when the Vikings were No. l among Michigan's preps.

NORTHERN WON its first regional since 1962 with 32½ points to runner-up Northwestern's 28

The fact that Northern's total was the lowest winning score by a Flint team in the era after World War II suggests that maybe the Vikings won't appear so powerful in next Saturday's state Class A championships at Ann Arbor. Coach Norbert Badar's

forces in the state meet will be small but mighty, based on Friday's efforts. Northern won the 880 and mile relays in times which undoubtedly will be good enough for points next week. If the Vikings can improve just a little they'll capture a bagful of which first place is worth 10 points.

RON LIGHT won the low hurdles in 20.4 seconds and qualified with third place in the highs. Ron Polk qualified in the 100 and 220 dashes and Don Forte in the 440.

Polk anchored the 1:29.4 victory in the 880 relay where his mates were Tom Jackson, Mel Kelly and Joe Young. Forte, Young, Brod Crump and John Butler won the mile

relay in 3:24.0.
This meet was aptly named the Flint regional because Genesee County schools had a ball. After the Northern-Northwestern one-two came Southwestern with 25 ½ points, Central 19 ½ and Kearsley 16. Beecher was 10th with 101/2 points.

OF 41 INDIVIDUALS who qualified for the state meet 26 are from the Flint area. All six relay teams who qualified are from the Flint

Northwestern's Delma Williams was the big qualifier, making the grade in the long jump and both hurdles although he failed to win. The Wildcats qualified Ray Johnson in the 880 and Les Clerklev in the 440 and their 880 relay team.

However, Johnson may be unable to run hereafter because he suffered the most tragic injury of the meet. He made the grade easily Friday in the one-mile run preliminaries with a 4:18.6 clocking. He tied for third behind a 4:18.2 heat win-


Baldwin had qualified for the two-mile finals in Thursday's prelims.



Seven East champs wen regional crowns, including Bellairs, Smith (twice), Kline and Torres from Flint. Clerk-ley and Northern's 880 team were the only West champs to add regional crowns. Walling was the only Big Nine champ who prevailed in tougher regional battling.

Because a pre-meet rain-storm and a slight headwind prevented perfect conditions, only the top three in most events qualified for the state meet. However, six pole vaulters cleared 12-8 and qualified and fourth place in the long jump qualified.
