# Huron Runners Finish Fourth

**BATTLE CREEK** — When  
the chips have been down in the  
big meets, Dan Bender has  
been coming through with the  
big effort for the Huron High  
track team.

Bender was the lone Huron  
athlete to win an individual  
South Central Conference  
championship in the league  
meet at the Lakeview High  
track, here, last night.

The senior won the shot put  
with a toss of 48 feet 6 inches  
which in itself is a pretty  
respectable effort. Even though  
he won the event, Bender was  
hoping for better things.

"He had a toss of 51 feet 7  
inches in a conference dual  
meet and he was looking to do  
the same thing in this meet,"  
said Huron Coach Kent Over-  
bey. "He is a money putter."

Just last Saturday, Bender  
won the Class A Regional Meet  
title at Belleville. He threw the  
shot some 52 feet 7 inches on  
that occasion.

Talk about versatility, Bend-  
er runs a leg on the Huron 880-  
yard relay team. How many  
big, strong shot putters can  
make the same claim?

Bender's performance was  
the high point for the Hurons as  
East Lansing won the team  
title with 18 points. The Tro-  
jans gained six of those points  
by finishing first in the dual  
meets with a 5-0 record and got  
the other 12 for winning the  
league meet.

The meet was conducted  
under ideal conditions and the  
athletes responded by breaking  
four meet records and tying  
another.

East Lansing's Ossama  
Shaikh won the 100-yard dash in  
:09.8 to break the old standard  
of :10 set by Tom Smith of Eve-  
rett in 1964 and tied by Craig  
Cossey of East Lansing in 1966.

Then in the other sprint, Mike  
Griffin of Lansing Everett was  
clocked in :22.1 in the 220-yard  
dash to break George Russell's  
old mark of :22.3. The former  
Huron High runner set the  
mark last spring.

East Lansing got another new  
record when Paul Timmick won  
the long jump in 22 feet ½  
inch. The old record was set by  
Rick Pickering of Parkside at  
21 feet 10½ inches in 1966.

The Adrian mile relay team  
of Jim Lemon, Darrell Lathrup,

Chuck Haddon and Dave Eddy  
won their race in 3:24.9. The  
former standard of 3:27.5 was  
set by Battle Creek Lakeview in  
1969.

On that relay, Eddy ran a  
:49.7 anchor quarter-mile. Ear-  
lier he won the mile run at  
4:25.5. All of this should be  
good news for Michigan track  
fans because this athlete is  
Wolverine bound.

The other record that was  
tied came in the 180-yard low  
hurdles. Dave Fugate of Jack-  
son Parkside won in :19.8 which  
tied the mark held by Andy  
Peck of Lakeview in 1968.
