Schulze was an easy winner in the event, clocking a: 10.2, three-tenths of a second ahead of the second-place finisher.

Jewel Swinton of Vassar placed fourth in the 440-yard dash for the Vulcans. Swinton

ran a :50.7 quarter.
Al Michalak of Caro scored Al Michalak of Caro scored points in the shot put with a heave of 51-feet-3, good for seventh place. The only other area point scorer was Mt. Clemens Chippewa Valley's mile relay team which placed seventh in 3:31.6.
