

Michigan boys win junior track meet

BOWLING GREEN, Ohio (AP) — Michigan placed first in boys competition and Kansas first in the girls division to take top team honors at the Bowling Green National Junior Champs Invitational track meet here Saturday.

Fred Singleton of New York was voted outstanding performer by a committee of coaches. He placed first in the 180-yard high hurdles with 13.5 and 180-yard low hurdles with 18.8.
