## City Salutes Gal and Team

A 12-year-old girl who set a world record for long jumping in her age group was among 62 Detroit youngsters honored Tuesday by Mayor Gribbs and Common Council.

Anita Lee of 18010 Maine led Detroit's team to a third-place overall finish in the U.S. Youth Games in New York last month. Teams from 13 cities were competing.

Miss Lee, a Nolan Junior High School eighth grader who stands 5 feet 4, won two first-place trophies.

One was for her broad jump of 18 feet 6¼ inches, a new record for girls 12 and 13 years old. The second trophy was for her high jump of 5 feet 2¾ inches.

Competition in the Youth Games was in three categories: Track and field, basketball and bowling.

Detroiters aged 9 to 15 won a second-place team trophy in track and field and a third-place trophy in basketball. The Detroit bowling team placed sixth.

Second-place trophies went to Levi Jackson, 15, of 6102 Fisher; Rodney Johnson, 15, of 19150 Buffalo, and Theodore Justice, 15, of 4446 Montclair.

Vanessa Marzette, 15, of 5744 Loraine, won a fourth-place trophy.

The 36 boys and 26 girls won the right to represent Detroit in competition sponsored by the Parks and Recreation Department. Competition was conducted this summer at 341 Detroit locations.

Each of the 62 received a key to the city. Mayor Gribbs proclaimed Tuesday the team's day, and coaches received certificates of appreciation.
