The boys are coming home. They came from Los Angeles and Huntsville, Ala., to participate in the 14th annual Olympian Games track finals Thursday night at Houston Stadium.

IT DIDN'T SEEM to matter if they won medals or not. What mattered most was the chance to get together.

Rod Johnson, 28, is an engineer for McDonnell-Douglas, an aircraft firm in Los Angeles. Dale, 27, is a meteorologist for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) at Huntsville. Ken, 20, soon will be departing home to attend the University of Michigan's branch at Dearborn. All are former Central High trackmen. All competed for

Junior College. The older two graduated from University of Michigan.

"We weren't anything special but we liked to run," explained Rod and Dale chimed in, "The youngest was the best," referring to Ken who had a fine season last spring at JC and was second in the Michigan JC Conference 440-yard hurdles.

ROD SMILED AND pointed out, "My time tonight was better than anything I ran at Junior College." He was third in 17.2 seconds for the 120 high hurdles and also placed third in the 180 low hurdles.

Ken won the highs in 16.1 and was second in the lows. Dale didn't get a medal but he was pleased just to be there with his brothers.
