

# Spartan Harriers Drop Meet To Reed City

SCOTTVILLE — "Hustl'n" Herb Lindsay broke the WSCC course record in 12:55 and was able to rest for over a minute before he saw the remainder of Reed City's team "cross the line".

And when those red clad runners come down the hill there were enough of them to beat Mason County Central 26-31.

Lindsay will . . . unless Coach Bruce Krieger finds a Spartan-ian who's hiding some running

talents . . . be back next year to break his own time as "the machine" is only a junior. The old mark of 13:48 was held for two days by Steve Barrett of Ludington.

"I said they were good when we ran them the first time," said Central Coach Krieger. The first time around Central beat the Coyotes on their course by a score of - take one guess - 26-31. And that was Reed City's only dual loss against 11 wins.

Krieger was especially happy the way the Williams Brothers,

Rob and Mike, ran.

Denny Anthes finished second in 14:07; Rob Williams third in 14:11; Mike Williams fifth, 14:36; Bill Thompson ninth, 15:02; and Pat Wilson 12th, 15:28.

After Lindsay, it was Mike Eichenberg fourth, 14:25; Ginnabaugh sixth, 14:55; Bob Daniels seventh, 15:02 and Gary Harper eighth, 15:09 fo Dale Clark's Coyotes.

Mason County Central's record for duals is now 10-3 with all three losses being to class B schools. Reed City and Ludington counted for two of those, but Central, also, beat each of them in a dual this year. The other loss was to Whitehall, but the Spartans sort of evened that by finishing ahead of the Vikings at the Ludington Invitational.

Krieger takes his runners to the Fennville Invitational Saturday.
