Judging by the results of this football season it appears that the only school with a chance of interfering with Fruitport's budding Seaway Conference dynasty is Ludington. And the Orioles are going to be hard-pressed.

Thursday night at Oriole Field, the Trojan Jayvees rolled to an easy 26-0 victory over the injury ridden LHS reserves.

The loss left Ludington with a 5-2 record and two straight defeats. Fruitport maintained their perfect record, now 6-0-1. The lone tie came in their season opener against Kenowa Hills.

Fruitport scored their first TD late in the first quarter when they tallied on a 15-yard pass
