## THE GOOD ONES WIN

Although 46 meet records have been broken in the Mansfield Relays in the seven meets staged at Mehock Field, last year's performance should be improved upon in 1971.

The Relays were staged last year on a day that saw the mercury hover in the low 30's and the frigid air took its toll on the athletes. The law of averages would indicate April 17th will be a warmer day.

The incimate weather didn't prevent the establishing of two of the old meet's most impressive records. Niles McKinley's talented Les Nagy ripped off the mile in 4:13.8, totally smashing the old mark of 4:16.5.

The 880 record was reduced one-tenth second by Keven Reabe of Waterford (Mich.) Kettering, a fine performance in the cold. The third mark cracked was in the high jump where Garrad Pettus, of Belleville, Mich., soared 6' 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ ".

As always, the best in the midwest will compete in the 40th Relays. The records will fall if the conditions are right. In any case, the meet will again be a proving ground for the top athletes — the eventual state champions.

Year after year the boys who look good in the Relays have shown their class in late May when the state crowns are decided.

It will be the same this time; if a boy can win at Mansfield, he's of champion caliber for sure.

## RELAYS STANDARDS

For years, the Mansfield Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, West Virginia, Indiana and Canada.

The ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards. This idea was presented to over 100 coaches, representing participating schools. The following standards are a composite of their replies.

Individuals entered by the coaches must have achieved the standards in their event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.

## TROPHIES AND MEDALS

All Trophies and Medals are the compliments of Mansfield people interested in the success of the Mansfield Relays. Your thanks should be addressed to the donor listed in the program.

A rotating Mansfield Relay Trophy will be awarded the team compiling the most points. This is a 36-inch trophy.

A beautiful trophy will be awarded the team making the most points in the field events.

A beautiful trophy will be presented to the team making the most points in the track events. This does not include relays.

Trophies will be awarded the first ten teams in the scoring. These are 20 inch trophies.

A beautiful 20 inch trophy will be given the winner of each relay event.

Gold Plate medals will be given the individual and relay winners.

Silver Plate medals will be given to the individual and relay winners of second place.

Gold Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of third place.

Copper Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fourth place.

Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fifth place.

Sixth Place will receive no awards other than one team point.

## SEATING ARRANGEMENTS

### For Coaches and Athletes

Additional bleachers are set up on north of field for athletes to relieve the congestion in the infield.

There is an area in the main bleacher section for coaches with access to the field. Slag walks are installed so the mud should be no factor in case of rain.

Also the pole vault pit, in use for the finals, will be at the end of the field to make for better viewing. (Foam rubber will be used in pole vault and high jump pits.)

Scores for events will be announced over the Public Address System.

The Mansfield Relays committee is privileged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 40th renewal of the Mansfield Relays which will be staged April 16-17, 1971. "America's largest independent inter-scholastic classic" will be staged at Malabar High School's Mehock Field track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1971 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1970 meet, all-time records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The Relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1970 renewal drew 291 high schools from six states — Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Kentucky and Canada. On hundred forty-four of the schools were from outside Ohio. The field numbered 2,849 athletes.

## ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

**Sanction** — The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

**Entry Fee** — One dollar a boy or not to exceed \$15.00 a team.

**Deadline for Entries** — April 5, 1971.

**Lodging** — Accommodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 16th and Breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all four mile relay teams, medley relay teams and 2-mile contestants. PLEASE STATE DEFINITELY THE NUMBER OF ATHLETES WHO WILL STAY OVERNIGHT. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return home.

**Track** — We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. The track cost us \$60,000. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface.

**Only spikes not exceeding one-fourth inch may be worn on the asphalt surfaces. However, if the athlete desires to wear rubber indoor shoes that is his privilege. The athletes' shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.**

Shot putters and discus throwers must wear rubber soled shoes due to the fact that the pad areas are cement.

**DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.**

**Eligibility** — All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals.

**Heat Leaders** — Please designate heat leaders in their respective events.

**Classification** — There is no classification.

**Points** — Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows — 10-8-6-4-2-1.

**Lunch** — Lunch will be served in the High School Cafeteria for a nominal sum at 10:30 a.m.

## SPECIAL REGULATIONS — ATTENTION

**FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE** — Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

**Preliminaries**—Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the mile, 440 yd. dash, 2 mile relay, 4 mile relay, 880 yd. relay, Medley relay, 880 yd. run, shuttle relay, mile relay, two mile run which will run in sections against time.

**Relay Exchange** — The 880 yd. relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

**Pole Vault and High Jump** — In the pole vault prelims the bar will be placed at 12 FT., and in the high jump at 5 FT., 10 IN. Vaulters and Jumpers can warm up at lower heights, but this must be done before the time scheduled for the event to start. In order to prevent unnecessary delay in the pole vault, competitors may, at the discretion of the officials in charge, be required to be ready to vault or jump within two minutes after the previous competitor's trial or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

**Rules** — Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

**Out-of-State Schools** must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohio High School Athletic Association.

**Restrictions** — Any boy who runs the 880 or the mile run cannot take part in more than one other track event. A boy cannot compete in more than three track events. The relays shall be counted as track events. No boy can compete in more than four events of which only three can be track events. Any boy who runs in the 2-mile run cannot take part in any other running event.

**Shot Put** — Only puts of over 49 feet will be measured.

**Discus** — Only throws of over 130 feet will be measured.

**Long Jump** — Only jumps over 20 feet will be measured.
