### Phil Brooks Alma's New Grid Coach

ALMA—Philip L. Brooks, whose East Lansing High School football team captured the South Central Conference championship with a 4-0-1 record, was named head football coach at Alma College Friday. Brooks replaces Dennis Stutz, who Thursday assumed his new position as a defensive coach for the Michigan State football team.

Before taking over as head coach at East Lansing in 1969, Brooks was a football coach at a high school in Corunna and at Lansing's Gabriels and Resurrection high schools. His career record as a coach is 66-22-4.

### U.S. Hockey Team Triumphs

GENEVA (AP) — Watch out for U.S. the hockey team in the 1972 Winter Olympics at Sapporo, Japan.

That was the word today from Coach Murray Williamson of Edina, Minn., even though the Americans were relegated to Group B in the World Ice Hockey Championships Friday night.
