Trojans Nip Hills

Saginaw High Races to 61-57 Track Win

Sports schedules that list Saginaw High vs. Arthur Hill are insured intense competition and Tuesday's track meet at Saginaw High was no exception.

Saginaw High pulled out a hard-pressed 61-57 victory over the Hillite thinclads in the only scheduled meeting this season between the cross-town rivals.

The Trojans wrapped up the close meet in the next to last event, the 200-yard dash, when Saginaw High runners placed first and third. Arthur Hill's crack mile relay team dashed to victory in the final event, but it was too late.

"We knew it was going to be a close contest," Claude Marsh, Saginaw High's track coach said. "We wanted to come out of the field events with 18 points and that's what we got. Arthur Hill is real strong in the distance races and we knew we would do well in the sprints and hurdles."

Both schools have young squads and both coaches claim all they need to be really strong is a man or two in the opposite school's specialities. "We sure need a couple of sprinters," Arthur Hill coach John McCarger said before the meet. Marsh would probably like to have a good miler or middle distance man to add to his lineup.

None of the times in the intra-city meet were especially impressive, but the weather probably had something to do with it. With temperatures in the 40s and a chilly wind blow-

ing, both teams seemed almost reluctant to doff the warm-up suits.

Ken McKinnon captured three events for the Trojans, despite being out of action all of last week with a pulled muscle. McKinnon placed first in the long jump and both hurdle events. Cal O'Neal won the shot put and ran a leg on the 880-yard relay effort. Reggie Jones anchored the winning 880-yard relay team and took firsts in the 100 and 220-yard dashes.

Hillite standouts were Marty Zucker and John Rolf. Zucker placed first in the mile run and ran the third leg in Arthur Hill's winning mile relay performance. Rolf also had a hand

in the mile relay and captured the 440-yard event.

The turning point in the meet was the 200-yard sprint where Trojans runners Reggie Jones and Hurley Coleman took two of the three spots. Arthur Hill's John Dersch barely edged Coleman for second place, but the Lumberjacks needed to win the event to win.

CMU Divides as Allen Sparkles in Relief

DETROIT (AP) — Wayne State pitcher Gordy Reck held Central Michigan to one hit Tuesday, then in the final frame slashed a triple and raced home on a throwing error for the game's only run as the Tartars edged the Chippewas 1-0 in college baseball.

It was WSU's first victory over Central Michigan since 1958 and upped Reck's career mark to 13 victories to tie a school record.

It was also the first time CMU was shutout since the 1969 season.

In the nightcap, Central Michigan returned for a 3-0 victory on the two-hit pitching of Gary Lewandowski and Glen Allen.

Allen, who is from St. Charles, limited Wayne to just a scratch single in three innings of work. He fanned six and recorded his third save this season.

Outfielder Leo Haynes from Flint drove in one run for the Chips and scored another. He also made a sparkling defensive play.
