# Johnson, Lewis Star Individually Reds Place Fifth At CMU Relays

(Special To The Times Herald) — PLEASANT — Paced by Rob Johnson's first place finish in the long jump, the Port Huron Big Reds compiled 24 points to finish fifth in the Class A division of the Central Michigan University Relays Saturday.

Johnson's winning leap of 29-feet-10 1/2 inches was far short of his 34-feet-8 1/2 inch season record. He also won the 100-yard dash in 18 seconds flat to become Saturdays only double winner.

Midland Dow, co-champion with Rockford in Class B last year, jumped in Class A this year and finished a strong third with 32 points. Rockford, also moved to Class A, was second.

Defending "A" champ Port Huron finished fifth with 24 points. Thirty-seven schools participated in Class A, 27 in Class B, 33 in Class C, and 38 in Class D.

# Former U-M Star Yearby Posts Necessary Bond

DETROIT (AP) — University of Michigan All-American football star Bill Yearby posted a \$10,000 bond Saturday for release from Wayne County Jail, where he had been held since Wednesday in the stabbing of his estranged wife.

Yearby, 26, was arrested about 8 p.m. Wednesday at the home of his mother-in-law, where his wife Karen, 24, was living awaiting a final divorce decree, according to police.

Yearby was arrested under the 1st contract. The 6-foot-three-inch, 235-pound Yearby was a basketball and football star at Detroit's Eastern High School.
