

# Hillites, Trojans Sweep Twin Bills

Arthur Hill and Saginaw High's baseball teams made Monday a day to remember by both sweeping doubleheader victories.

The Hillites took 7-2 and 9-2 decisions over Flint Northern at Flint, while the Trojans measured Midland 3-1 and 5-3, here.

Arthur Hill's twin win coupled with Flint Northwestern's doubleheader split with Pontiac Central, gave the Hillites undisputed possession of first place in the Saginaw Valley League Western Division stadings. Both Arthur Hill and Northwestern went into the day's activities with 7-3 conference records.

Saginaw High, 5-7 in the SVL Eastern race, hurt Midland's chances plenty. The Chemics were only one game behind Flint Southwestern, the loop pacesetter.

Guy Losee and Rick Rummel went the distance on the hill for Arthur Hill in its two games while Dewey McCoy and Charles Jones toed the rubber all the way for Saginaw High's two.

North Branch's Roger Blumerich fanned 21 batters in 11 innings and still lost a 4-1 decision to Millington. Millington is yet to taste defeat in 11 starts and rules the Greater Thumb Conference with an 8-0 mark.

The track future at Saginaw High shows a lot of promise. The Trojans underclassmen piled up 87 points to capture the Sophomore Relays in Bay City. Bay City Handy and Midland deadlocked for second with 64 points each and Alpena and Midland Dow rounded out the top five.

Saginaw High set two meet records. A time of 1:03.7 in

the hurdle relays by Jim Snead, Richard Stevenson, Willie Dawkins and Robert Chapman snapped the old mark, and the quartet of Ron McKellar, Chapman, Bernice Smith and Reggie Jones established another record with a 1:36.4 880-yard relay effort.

MT. PLEASANT, Mich. (AP) — Central Michigan University won its eighth and ninth baseball games in a row by sweeping a doubleheader from Wayne State University 16-0 and 6-4 Monday.

The standout of the first game was winning pitcher Ralph Darin, who smashed in two home runs and a single. The victory gave the River Rouge junior a perfect 8-0 pitching record.

CMU also got three hits from Jim Cooper, who drove in four runs, Andy Kanoza, and Dick Watkins, who smacked in a homer.

In the second game, CMU scored four runs in the second inning, including a two-run homer by Watkins. CMU had built a 6-0 lead after three innings.

Wayne State scored two in the fourth on four singles and collected two more in the sixth on a homer by Jim Oberliesen.

CMU, ranked second nationally in collegiate division, now has a 27-4-1 record. Wayne State is 11-14.
