Butler Sets School Mark While Finishing Fourth

CLASS B MICHIGAN CENTER — Marysville's Jim Butler broke his own school record that he just set last Monday but even that burst of speed in the mile run at the State Class B. Track meet wasn't enough for first place honors.

Jim finished fifth with a time of 4:28.4 in the State meet. His record mile Monday was 4:29.7.

Other area Class B Winners included Al Michalak, Caro, who finished fifth in the shot put with a toss of 54-feet 2½ inches.

Kurt Nunn, Crosswell-Lexington, hurdled to fifth place in the 120-yard high hurdles with a time of :15.45 seconds.

Holly took top honors in the Meet with 38 points and didn't even have a first place winner. Ecourse placed second with 29 points and Grand Ra-

pids West Catholic was third with 27 points.

The Mile Relay was won by Detroit Lutheran West; the Pole Vault by David Hensen, Holland West Ottawa with a pole spring of 13-feet 4 inches.

John Stuyvenberg of Northville won the long jump with a flying leap of 22 feet 3 inches.

Roy Young, Mount Morris, took the 220 yard dash with a time of :22.9.2, and Jeff Middledorf, Harper Woods Lutheran East, pushed the shot put 56-feet-3½ inches for first place.

Carsonville's Mile Relay team finished eighth and the 880-yard relay team legged it in to 10th place in the State Class D. Track Meet at Big Rapids.

The Mile Relay team had a time of 3:43.8 and the 880-yard relay team finished with a time of 1:37.8.

Unionville won the meet with 74 points; Camden Frontier, took second place with 46½ points and the Michigan School for the Deaf finished third with 41 points.

John Burley, Michigan School for the Deaf with a leap of 5 feet 11 inches, took top spot in the high jump and Rod Seder, Arenac Eastern with a

pole spring of 13 feet 1½ inches, broke the record of 12 feet 8 inches and won the pole vault honors.

In the 880 yard relay it was Michigan School for the Deaf with a time of 1:34.2.

Ed Robinson Michigan School for the Deaf took the 110 yard dash with a time of :10.2 and Art Morris, Covert, won the low hurdles with a time of :20.8.

Greg Sanderson, Lawton, took the two-mile run with a time of 10:17.7.
