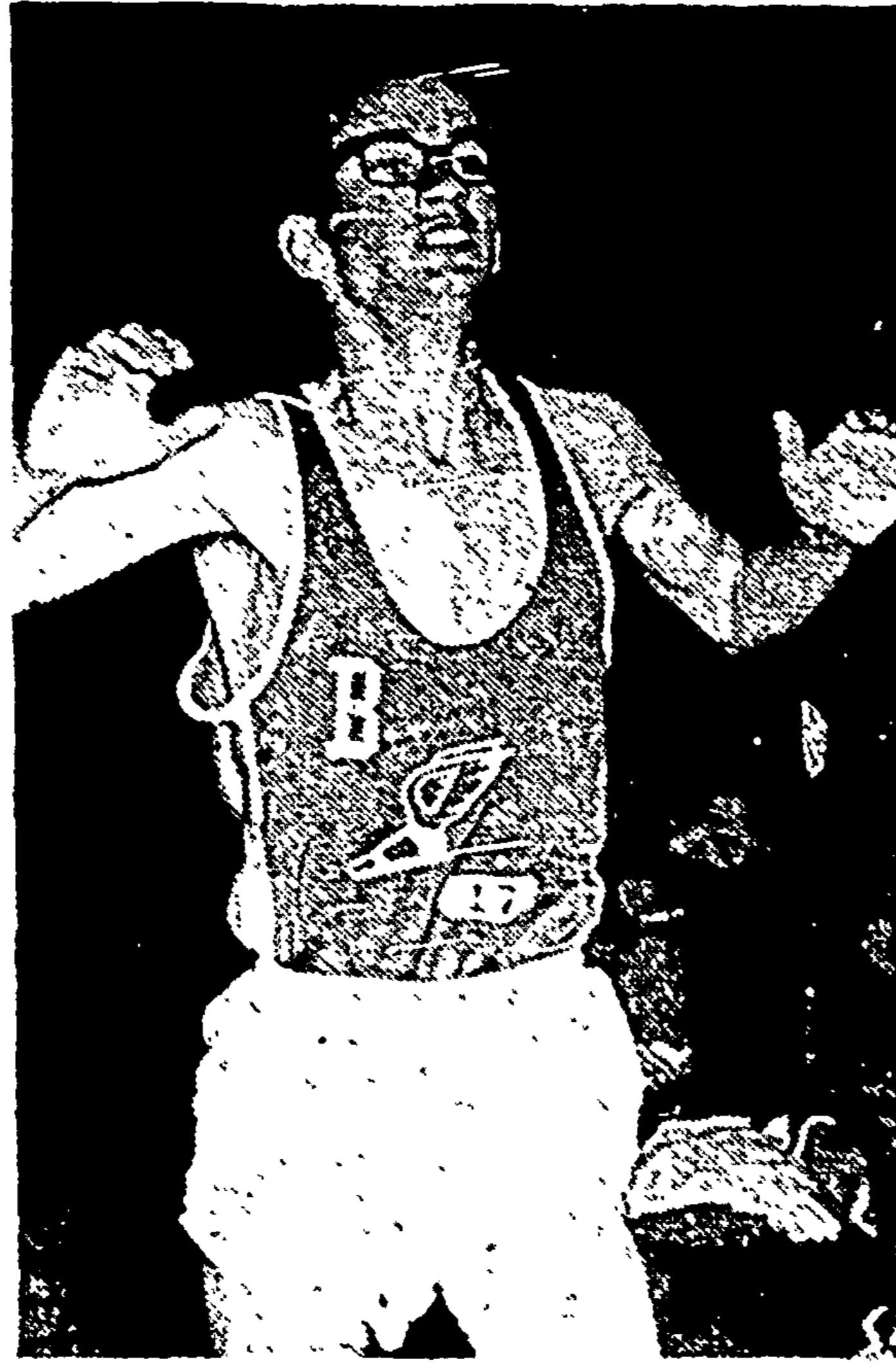

Peaphon Excels in Korf Meet

It was more like football than track weather. But despite the cold winds and wet track Bridgeport's Gary Peaphon had one of the finest nights of his career to be named the outstanding athlete of the second annual Herb Korf Saginaw County Invitational track meet Tuesday at Saginaw High.

Peaphon, a senior, celebrated his 18th birthday by winning the 100 and 220-yard dashes, anchoring the Bearcats' win in the 880 relay and taking a second in the long jump before a disappointing crowd of 200.

Saginaw High's Ken McKinnon, who missed the meet because of a severe leg injury, won the inaugural trophy as the most outstanding athlete last year.

A few other athletes were in the running for the trophy late in the proceedings, but Peaphon dismissed any doubt of who the winner would be by taking a first in the 220 in the second to last event.

Peaphon nervously paced the infield and his coach, Len Callard, sat in the stands waiting for the announcement of the MVP award.

The Bridgeport followers roared with approval and many of the athletes from other schools congratulated Peaphon on his outstanding achievements on a terrible night for running.

Rain was the big culprit. It came down hard Monday and continued early Tuesday. But, since the meet is held so late in the season the meet committee decided it was best to hold the event on the scheduled day despite the conditions of the track.

Peaphon and Saginaw High's Reggie Jones offered the crowd a pair of exciting races in the 100 and 220. Peaphon proved the stronger and faster

The Bridgeport ace tied his own meet record in the 100 with a 10.0 clocking, while Jones pulled in right behind him at 10.05. Peaphon still had enough late in the meet to outrun the field in the 220 and set a meet record at 22.4. He won the event last year with a time of 22.8. Jones had the lead in the 220 late in the race, but came in second with a run of 22.5.

Peaphon anchored the Bearcats' win in the 880 relay as Bob Yore, Tim Peaphon and Carlos Gonzales turned in a fine 1:33.5 clocking to set another record. Last year's winner Carrollton took the event in 1:33.9.

Peaphon placed second to Jim Jones in the long jump at 20.4.

Six meet records were set and another tied despite the weather. The wind was cold

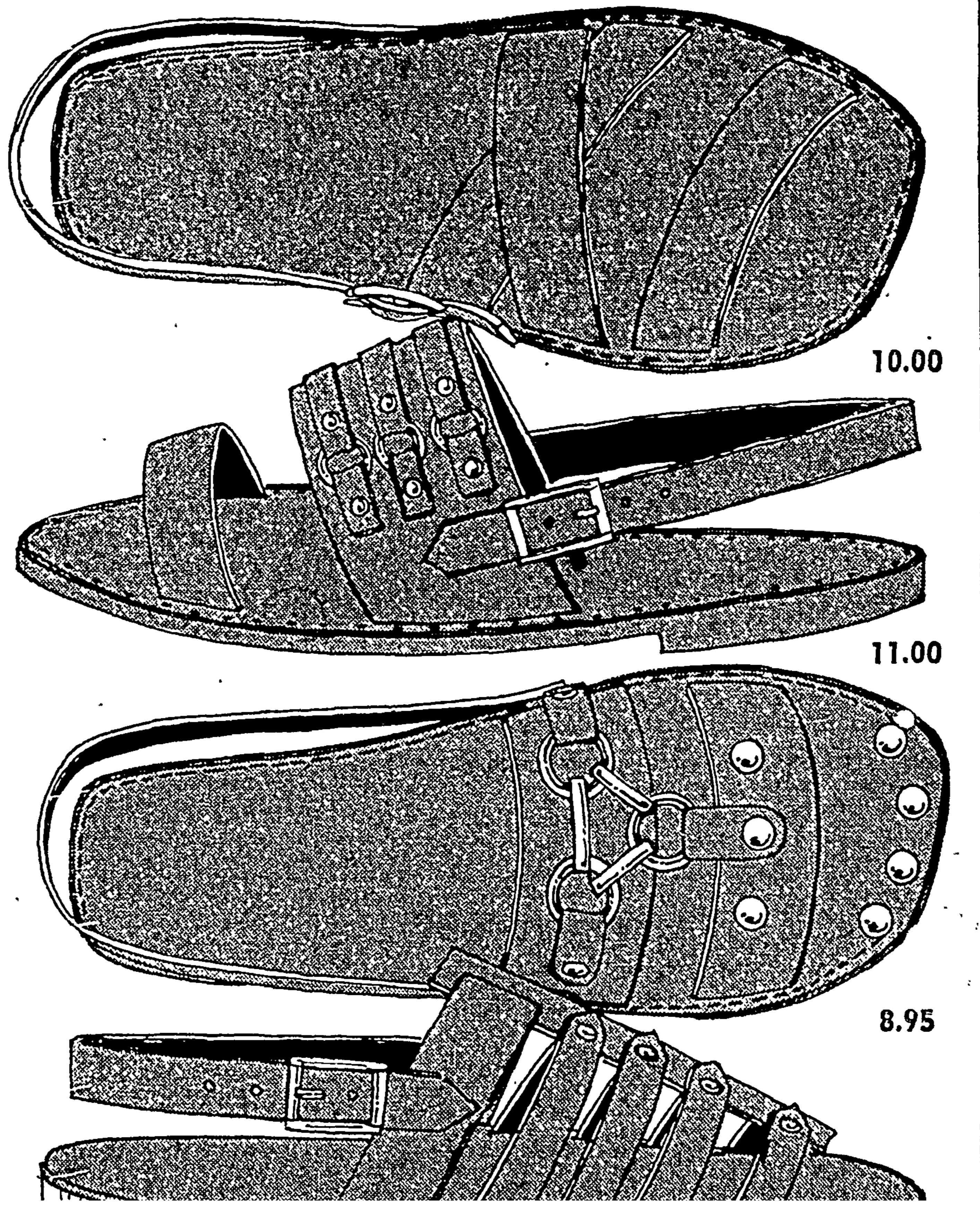
Campy Picks Wolverines
