## Marshall Dill Cops 100, 220

LOMBARD, Ill. (AP) — A record crowd of 5,000 watched in 90-degree heat Saturday as every meet record but one fell in the All-American High School Track and Field Championships at Glenside East High School.

Randy Lightfoot, of Plainview, Tex., was named the meet's outstanding athlete after his 13.4 clocking in the 120-yard high hurdles bettered the national high school record by one-tenth of a second.

The only record that did not fall was in the pole vault where the winning jump by Roger Martin, of Camden High School in San Jose, Calif., was 15-feet-4½.

The All-American championships are an outgrowth of the Golden Midwest Meet whose records were used in comparing Saturday's performances.

In the triple jump all six competitors surpassed the meet record of 45-feet-5½ inches., with the winning leap turned in Dale Krebs of Gunn High School in Palo Alto, Calif.

Marshall Dill of Northern High School in Detroit won both the 100-yard dash and the 220-yard dash in respective times of 9.4 and 20.8.
