

Spartan Cross Country Splits Double Dual

NORTH MUSKEGON—Mason County Central's Cross Country team ran past North Muskegon 25-34, but were edged by Whitehall 26-29, Thursday. Whitehall also defeated North Muskegon 25-34.

The double-dual was held at the Lincoln Hills Golf Course. Class B Whitehall of the Seaway conference had four boys finish in the top ten to sneak past the Spartans.

"Today just wasn't our day," said Coach Bruce Krieger of Central. "Had a couple of kids missing and then this loss . . ."

One of the kids to miss the meet was MCC's Bill Thompson who injured his hand while working earlier in the day and

was unable to compete.

"However," said Krieger, "Thompson should be able to run Tuesday."

Tuesday, the Spartans host North Muskegon in a conference dual at W.S.C.C. which could give some hint as to who will be the 1971 WMC champs.

The double dual top ten finishers were: Bill Jackson, Whitehall 13:24; Gary Ray, NM, 13:26; Rob Williams, MCC, 13:28; Denny Anthes, MCC, 13:29; Jim Peters, NM, 13:39; Pat Quigley, W, 14:09; Jeff Quigley, W, 14:10; Pat Wilson, MCC, 14:12; Jeff Oslund, NM, 14:14; Lonnie Schmalzer, W, 14:20.

Central's John Dongvillo finished 11th; Mike Williams 13th; Mark Dobias 14th; Dale Cook 15th; Mike Spencer 21st; Clay Martz 23rd, and Mike Buck 24th.

The Spartans are 3-1 for the season and remain undefeated 1-0 in Western Michigan Conference running.

Freshman Chris Raven shot a 41 to lead the Spartans scoring. He was followed by Rich Moeckel's 42; John Adams' 45; and Denny Thompson's 46. Match medalist was North Muskegon's Dick Fosler's 40. Jerry Joynson was two strokes behind with a 42. John Jewett and Tim Thornton each finished with a 44, four strokes back of the leader.
