

# Evans Beaten By McGrady

CLEVELAND (Ohio) — (AP) — World indoor record holder Martin McGrady avenged two straight defeats to Lee Evans and won the 600-yard run in 1:10.7 in last night's Cleveland K of C track meet.

Evans, representing the Bay Area Striders, finished second in 1:11.2 over the new \$20,000 hardwood, 11-lap track.

McGrady's time was disappointing to track officials, who expected to see the 1:10 meet record he set on a 12-lap track in 1968 broken. McGrady, representing the California International Track Club, holds the world indoor mark of 1:07.6.

Defending event champion Tommy Turner of Murray State tripped himself out of the race rounding the first turn.

Other times recorded in the meet were also disappointing, although Gerald Tinker of the Kent Track Club lowered the meet 50-yard dash standard of 5.2 to 5.1 in the preliminaries.

Bob Ware of the Philadelphia Pioneers finished second in Tinker's trial heat to oust one of the favorites, U.S. Army Capt. Charles Greene, from the finals.

Another favorite, U.S. Army Capt. Mel Pender, was eliminated on false starts in the finals, which Tinker won in 5.2 with Ware second and Dr. DeLano Meriweather third.

Willie Davenport of the Texas Striders, the world indoor record holder in the 50-yard high hurdles who won the event here in a 6.0 clocking, said he was not surprised that times were down. "I don't think the guys are in tip-top shape for records,"

said Davenport, who beat out Leon Coleman of Philadelphia to defend his 1971 Cleveland title.

"All of these guys are looking ahead to Olympic runs," he said, explaining that they were preparing gradually for the June Olympic trials.

He said the new track was good, but pointed out, "Sometimes you lay them down and they are fast, then the next year they are real slow."

Dave Wottle of Bowling Green State University won the one mile run in 4:06.6. Yevgny Arzhenov of the Soviet Union was a disappointing fifth.
