## Saginaw High, Arthur Hill Will Experiment at CMU

MOUNT PLEASANT - The Central Michigan University Invitational Indoor track meet might as well be changed to the Pontiac Central championships.

The Chiefs will go after their seventh straight meet championship here Friday in what has been the annual kick off to the spring, prep track season. The 18-team meet will be held in Finch Fieldhouse on tartan turf.

The meet, formerly known as the Arthur Hill-Saginaw Invitational, will get underway with preliminaries and field events at 5:15 and running finals at 8 p.m.

Saginaw High, Arthur Hill and Saginaw Douglas Mac-Arthur will compete in the event along with area teams from Midland, Mount Pleasant, Bay City Central and Bay City Handy.

Others in the 18-team field include Pontiac Northern, Flint Kearsley, Owosso, Waterford Township, Waterford Kettering, Grand Rapids Catholic Central, Muskegon Mona Shores, Traverse City, Flint Northern and Muskegon.

Central will again be one of the teams favored to take the team title, but after the past six years that seems more like a formality than a measure of the strong teams entered. The Chiefs will again feature a good balance of field event and sprint preformers. There are 294 athletes entered in the meet.

Stuparek was one of the top hurdlers in the state last season with a time of 14.8 seconds in the high hurdles 19.9 in the lows. He also managed to long jump 21 feet.

Saginaw High's Claude Marsh has one of the state's top sprinters in junior Reggie Jones. The 6-3 runner had a 10.0 100 and 22.4 in the 220 in last year's Class A state meet. He is coming off a serious knee injury and will not be at full strength.

"We're very interested in seeing what Reggie will do. He injured his right knee twice during the football season and is about at 90 per cent efficiency for the meet," Marsh mentioned, "Reggie has been working isometrics and lifting weights all winter to get his knee back to full strength. This meet will be a test for him as it will all our performers."
