SH's Jones Dashes 9.9 in 100

Saginaw High's Reggie Jones is coming of age as a prep sprinter in his junior campaign. He finished in the middle of the pack in the state meet last season, but he's destined for better things this time around.

The 6-3 Trojan went under 10 seconds in the 100-yard dash for the first time this season and in his career officially in a dual meet with Flint Southwestern Friday

afternoon.,

Jones turned the tape at 9.9 seconds to sound the alarm for all other sprinters in the state to be aware of what needs to be done to take over from departed Marshall Dill (now at Michigan State University) as the state's top sprinter

"The track was not very fast today, and he had to run into a slight wind. I'm really proud of Reggie He has worked hard all Year to improve and overcome the injury to his knee. And he's going to get better too," said Saginaw High track coach Claude Marsh.

Jones also won the 220 at 22.6. It was only the second time he's run the event this season. The junior dashman also ran the anchor leg of the Trojans' winning effort in 880 relay with a time of 1:34.1.

"Reggie and I had a bet that he wouldn't get under 10 seconds in the 100 by the third meet of the year But, he got under it all right there after the meet wanting me to pay up. He's a fine boy and is always in good spirits," said Marsh.

Southwestern won the meet, 69-54. But, the Trojans are coming along slow in the traditional Marsh style and should do well in the Valley East meet late May.

Senior Cal O'Neal, who is headed for University of Michigan on a football scholarship, won the shot put with a toss of 51-10 ½. His best throw of the season is 54-9 and is looking to surpass 55 feet for the school record before the year's out.
