MIDLAND — Midland High's team victory in the seventh annual George Graves Relays here Friday night was no surprise, but there were some raised eyébrows over the selection of the Chemics' Mike Stuparek as the most outstanding athlete of the meet.

Midland won three events, took second in three others and placed in 12 of the 15 events for a winning total of 43. Dow, which won only one event but had four seconds, took second at 34.

Saginaw High, led by Reggie Jones, finished third with four firsts and 26 points and Arthur Hill won two events and was second twice for sixth place with 21 points. Bullock Creek was eighth with 12, and Mount Pleasant ninth with 10. Saginaw High coach Claude Marsh and Arthur Hill coach John McCarger were pleased and encouraged by Friday's results, but Marsh was quite displeased with Stuparek winning over Jones as the meet's top athlete. - The 13 competing coaches voted for the top athlete of the meet and Stuparek received five votes to Jones' four. "I'm not taking anything away from (Mike) Stuparek as a track man or the performance he gave tonight, but I think that Reggie was the most outstanding athlete at this meet and should have won that distinction. I'm greatly disappointed at the decision," said Marsh. Though Marsh seemed more upset at Jones losing the outstanding athlete award than his team's fine showing, he had high praise for his athletes. + L The boys have worked very hard this spring and stuck with it when it was a very-hard thing to do. I'm'very proud of all of them," Marsh cited. Arthur Hill's McCarger again praised his young juniors and sophomores and stated he has high hopes for the remainder of this season. "When you have a lot of young kids like we do, some disqualifications are bound to happen (it did to Arthur Hill twice), but they're coming on and we've been working them awfully hard. Curt Thon, Jim Jones and John Combs all jumped 5-10 in the high jump for Arthur Hill's win there. Bullock Creek's Jesse Myers set a record in the high jump at 6-4%. Jack Brechtelsbauer, who cleared the bar at 12-6, Bob Brechtelsbauer and Jerry Wilson combined for the Hillites' pole vault win.

Stuparek anchored Midland's win in both hurdle events and long jumped 20-01/2. Foster had the longest jump at 20-2.
