Bay City Central Cops Net Match as Two Girls Post Individual Wins

BAY CITY—It's no longer a man's world in high school sports.

A pair of outstanding girl tennis players, Mary Hicks and Wendy Chapin, competed for the Bay City Central team here Tuesday

Both won their matches as Central blanked Saginaw High, 7-0

Their appearance was made possible by a temporary injunction issued in Detroit Monday by Federal Judge Damon Keith barring the Michigan High School Athletic Association from preventing girls from

competing in any high school sport, including football.

How id Saginaw High tennis Coach Roland Wilson feel about it? "Really, I think girls should have been allowed to play a long time ago, especially in the non-contact sports like tennis," said Wilson, who has been the Trojans' coach for the past six years. "They deserve a chance to play if they are good enough to make the team," Wilson went on to say. Miss Hicks, playing in the No. 4 singles position for Bay City, turned back



Saginaw High's Tom Quall in straight sets, 6-2, 6-0. She was followed by Miss Chapin in the No. 5 seeded match. Wendy lost the first set, 6-8, to Jeff Brennan, but rallied for 6-4, 6-1 decisions to win the match.

Neither girl nervous about playing for the first time on the boy's team, according to Wilson. "Mary Hicks was especially poised...everything she does is good and I wouldn't be, too surprised if she is their

No. 1 singles player next year," said Wilson.

Elsewhere, a lot of records fell in track and field competition.

Five track records at Eisenhower were shattered as the young Commanders took it on the chin, 100-23, from Mount Pleasant.

The Oilers' Bill Kile tossed the shot 53-6 to to take the track mark, while Eisenhower's Bill Taylor carved a school h record with his second place heave of 48-2 s

Mount Pleasant's Kelly Beltnick went 10.5 seconds in the 100-yard dash to tie the record, while Ted Roehrich posted a record 52.8 seconds in the 440 for another new mark.

Eisenhower's Kevin Taylor gobbled up the two mile event in 9:56 for a school and track record. Mount Pleasant's S80 relay quartet of Roehrich, Obe Nevabara, John MacLean and Beltnick set a new standard of 1:34.1. Midland Dow's Mark Foster turned in a 51.5 quarter mile for a school record in the Chargers 67-55 dual meet win over Flint Northwestern. Mike Beach of Bridgeport went ll-9 in the pole vault for a school record. The Bearcats won every event to nlobber Buena Vista, 107-16. Bob Yare had four first plae titles, while teammates Mike Arnold, Tim Peaphon and Dennis Morton swept three each.




