

Midland Thinclads Trip

MIDLAND—Midland High School track coach Gary Jozwiak doesn't have to worry about getting his team "up" for Midland Dow...the intercity rivalry with the Chargers takes care of it for him.

"Very definitely our kids try harder against Dow," says Jozwiak. Although a traveling trophy passes to the winner of the meet each year, just winning, itself, is enough incentive to perform well and both teams did when they renewed the rivalry Thursday afternoon.

Midland came out on top, 70-52-12, after the issue was undecided by the tie in last year's annual meet between the Chemical City schools. The Chemics haven't tasted defeat in their last 32 straight dual meets and finished this season's dual schedule with a 5-0 record.

Midland's Bill Eyre covered the mile in 4:31.2 for the best time by any miler in the area this season. Andy Kovac of St. Louis was the previous leader with 4:32.5.

Already the fastest half miler in the area, Dow's Paul Miller improved on his

best time with a 1:59.9 time for the 880. Dick Smith of Midland High, runnerup to Miller with a w:00.6 clocking, took second in the area times as well.

Other outstanding performances in the meet included a 53-5 1/4 distance in the shot put by Midland's Kevin Gay. Jeff Mesler tied the Chemics' junior record in the 100-yard dash with a 1p second flat time. Dow's Mark Foster scooted to a 51.5 second burst in the quarter mile to tie his own school record. He ranks second behind Bridgeport's Mike Arnold in that category of the area race.

Midland wasn't the only place where the track times were hotter than the weather. Arthur Hill sneaked by Bay City Central, 62-61, at Bay City where a number of track records fell by the wayside.

Jack Brechtelsbauer cleared 13feet in

the pole vault to establish a field record. The biggest records went to a pair of Central thinclads though, Bob Hunt eclipsed the two mile track and school record by nearly w5 seconds when he ran a 9:28.7. Half miler Bruce Johnson did amage to the Bay City records with a 1:58 flat time.

A bit of sharp strategy on the part of Hillite Coach John McCarger probably was the difference in the close meet. He scratched his best two-miler, John Deering, and entered him in the mile instead. As it turned out, Deering won the mile worth five points, instead of a second place three points behind the record pace of Hunt in the twin miles.

Saginaw High's School high jump record was shattered by Robert Chapman, who cleared the bar at 6-4 in a u6-47 dual meet win over Flint Powers.
